The church of Christ (Eglise du Christ) continues to thrive in Haiti in spite of rampant voodoo practices and denominationalism. The church is growing in the midst of political instability, economic problems, earthquakes, hurricanes, and disease. The church of Christ is on track to become the fastest growing church in this country.

The Delmas 28 church of Christ is now doing mission work in over 250 communities and helping 220 churches of Christ in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Our aim is to save the lost, edify the church, and support widows and orphans. We thank God for what has been accomplished so far in this field.

The January 2010 earthquake in Port-au-Prince completely destroyed our building at Delmas 28, but thanks to many Christians all of the world it has been rebuilt -- double its original size and more stable. Thanks be to God for this wonderful blessing!

During this past year, God has blessed us with 396 baptisms, 1200 restorations, and 21 weddings. We have planted eight new churches in Haiti, and have gone on eight mission trips.

We are thankful that the church of Christ in the community of Carissade (near the city of Hinche) has grown from 30 people to over 300 this year.

The church of Christ at St. Michel has warmed my heart as I attended and preached at their 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the church. They had over 1200 people attend this homecoming and 28 people were baptized.

This year we planted the Canaan church of Christ in this new community formed by refugees after the 2010 earthquake. Please pray for this church as we need a shelter for the church to meet in.

## **Television & Radio Programs**

In 2014 we launched a new television program – L'Heure de la Délivrance (Hour of Deliverance) on Channel 11 here in Port of Prince which covers all the major cities in Haiti. Many of the shows are available on the Internet through our YouTube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCasntBdq6zbZLax2d1-PcOA>).



Also on Sunday we broadcast a program on three FM radio stations (Megastar 97.3 FM in Port-au-Prince, Radio Louco FM in Miragoane, and Coty FM in Cotes-de-Fer) which covers three-fourths of the population of Haiti. We receive many phone calls and letters as a result of these programs. In cooperation with our brethren in Canada and French World Outreach ([www.FrenchWorldOutreach.org](http://www.FrenchWorldOutreach.org)), we send out French Bible Correspondence courses and literature to these contacts and to our sister congregations across Haiti.

## **Delmas School of Preaching**

We need trained, qualified preachers and workers to strengthen the church in southern and central Haiti. Accordingly, we began a School of Preaching at the Delmas 28 church of Christ building in Port-au-Prince. Thirty preacher students are now in training. We have six permanent teachers, as well as guest teachers covering New Testament

Survey, Old Testament Survey, Homiletics, Communication, Greek, Church History, and Theology. We are thankful to God for this great school. In this training, we are committed to keeping our identity – striving to reproduce Christians as they were in the New Testament times – adding them to Christ's body today.

## **Christian Schools Bringing Christ to our Youth**

In partnership with Christians who sponsor children's education through Hope for Haiti's Children ([www.HopeForHaitisChildren.org](http://www.HopeForHaitisChildren.org)), we assist in the management of ten Christian elementary schools and two Christian High Schools which teach over 2,500 children ages 3 to 22 throughout Haiti. Each school teaches the Bible as well as the required government curriculum. Our Delmas 28 facility houses the Delmas Christian School which teaches 519 children each day from age 3 to 22. We thank God that 29 teen students and 20 parents of students were baptized this past year.



In partnership with other Christians, we also are helping to support 84 orphans and 42 widows.

## Other Outreach Efforts

Late in the afternoons, we use our Delmas 28 facility to house a licensed School of Nursing program to train 150 nurses each year. It is licensed and rated as one of top seven nursing schools in the country by the Haitian Ministry of Health.
