The End of Italian School and a Thanksgiving Party

After three sessions of Italian Language School, I completed my school commitment shortly before Thanksgiving. Finishing language school was bittersweet. Attending school made up a large part of my first memories and experiences in Italy. I am so thankful for the time my teachers invested in me and my classmates and for my peers who become friends along the way. Though challenging, it provided me with enough language knowledge and confidence to spring-board me into future cultural interactions in which my Italian skills will be tested. Wish me luck!

While wrapping up our time at school we were simultaneously planning our Thanksgiving Party with our students at the Bible School. Due to our school schedule, we decided to host our dinner the week before we would normally celebrate Thanksgiving Day. In order to host all of our students (close to one hundred), the shopping, meal prep, and cooking began many days in advance. Never have I cooked for so many people before in my life, but with enough coordination and hard-work, we hosted around one hundred students and guests! Needless to say, we were exhausted and spent the following days (the actual week of Thanksgiving) recovering from this big event.

Departures and the end of a school term

Only a few days after our Thanksgiving Party at the school we started saying our goodbyes to some of our Avanti Co-workers. Miles and Meredith Thompson, who joined the program this fall, returned to the States to reapply for visas to live in Italy. Some may remember the difficulty I had in receiving a visa. Without a visa, they will not be allowed to stay in Italy for longer than a three month period. They are becoming like family to me and are encouraging to work with. They desire and have a willingness to work not only in Florence but within Italy in general. Please keep them in your thoughts and close in prayer when you think on them,

Most recently Jodi Luke, another new Avanti Worker and my current roommate, departed for Vicenza for a short survey trip. Vicenza is in northern Italy at the base of the Alps near the Austrian border. She is hoping to work with the congregation there and will spend the next two weeks meeting with the church members and leaders to learn how she may be most useful in that congregation. While many Avanti Workers stay in Scandicci while in Italy, some go out and work with other congregations. I am excited and eager for her to begin the work there that she already feels drawn to.

The school term at the Bible School will come to an end the second week of December. As we wrap up, I think back on the meetings and classes spent with my students. Each has a story and a life that I look forward to knowing more about when classes resume in the New Year. I wish I could share all the memories created with my students, but for now there is only enough room for one.

I started meeting with Esther shortly after our term started. She is the granddaughter of Rosa, a woman who has worked for the school for 20+ years as a cook. Due to a challenging English course, Rosa asked if I would take Esther on as an extra student for more focused grammar practice. In the beginning, we would meet and only review school lessons and assignments. Much of our time has also been spent with us just talking. I am learning more about her that exceeds hobbies and daily activities. She is a 14-year-old dealing with teenage issues and figuring out what she believes. I had been wondering for some time how our meetings would shift towards the Bible. In our most recent meeting, she did not bring anything to work on, and as we started talking I learned that she did not know the significance in her name. A door of opportunity had been opened and we began to read from the book of Esther. I am so thankful for the family that Rosa and Esther are quickly becoming to me, and I am very encouraged and hopeful that we will continue to explore the Word of God.

About Avanti Italia

The missions program I am a part of is called Avanti Italia (A.I.). This mission program has three primary goals: 1. to use our individual talents in sharing the Good News of Jesus the Christ with those who are seeking to have a more perfect relationship with Him, 2. to learn to share Christ with others more effectively, and 3.to participate in mutual encouragement and edification with the Italian churches of Christ. Their method for achieving these goals is mainly through outreach in teaching private Bible lessons in English. As a part of A.I., I would be expected to teach an average of 10-15 Bible lessons a week. Much of the work A.I. encourages would be described as friendship evangelism, making relationships with people and sharing God's saving message with them. Each team member is not only expected to fulfill their obligations, but also to find ways of using his or her individual talents to make more contacts with people. Most of the work is centered at the Florence Bible School in Scandicci, a suburb on the southwest side of Florence. A.I. has had an extensive outreach since its beginning in 1986. Every year, A.I. forms teams of 3-7 members to send to work at the school for a two-year commitment. Team members are required to fundraise, acquire a student visa, and go through intensive training before leaving the United States. Once arriving in Florence, team members live together at the Florence Bible School and immediately begin Italian language studies while teaching English using the Bible. Teachers generally work in one-to-one or small group sessions.
