## On the Ground...

1. Students Win Bible Awards!



We are thrilled to celebrate the award-winning students who recently **earned top scores on their annual Bible exams!** These students exhibited academic excellence and determination in their exam performance and received joyful commendation from their classmates, teachers, and school administrators. We also gratefully acknowledge our amazing HFHC educators, who work tirelessly to promote lifelong learning from a Biblical worldview and nurture, educate, and train every child in their care.

#### 2. Cite Soleil – Crisis Relief Response

Gang violence has steadily been on the rise in recent months. Stray bullets from warring gangs threaten the lives of anyone who walk in their path. Due to these extreme safety concerns, the government suspended their trash removal program in the area. This caused **trash to pile up** in ditches and oveflow from the banks. The path to/from the school was impassable for the children.

In January and February, group of local residents in Cite Soleil banded together to remove the trash, dig a trench to divert the water, and pave a pathway so that students could walk to school and keep their feet dry.

#### 3. Thomazeau Christain School Exands

The construction of the 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, and 13<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms underway at the Thomazeau Christian School. In just three weeks, they are ready to put on the roof and begin painting!

#### 4. Teacher Training Workshop

We are excited to showcase our amazing teachers and their commitment to excellence in Christian education! Recently, fifty teachers and five principals from HFHC's village schools met at Dubuisson Christian School for a three- day teacher training conducted by our educational partners at P4H Global. We are so grateful these educators were able to attend the training despite the ongoing turmoil in Haiti.
